TEEING GROUND:

The "*teeing ground*" is the starting place for the hole to be played. It is a rectangular area two club-lengths in depth, the front and sides which are defined by the outside limits of two tee-markers. The ball is outside the *teeing ground* when all of it lies outside the *teeing ground*. (In other words, you may not tee up your ball in front of the tee markers or more than 2 club lengths behind the markers.)

Penalty for Playing Outside the Teeing Ground:

- a. **MATCH PLAY:** If the player plays her ball from outside the teeing ground, there is **no penalty**, but her opponent may immediately require the player to cancel the stroke and play a ball from within the teeing ground.
- b. **STROKE PLAY:** If the player plays her ball from outside the teeing ground, **she incurs a penalty of two strokes** and must then play a ball from within the teeing ground.
